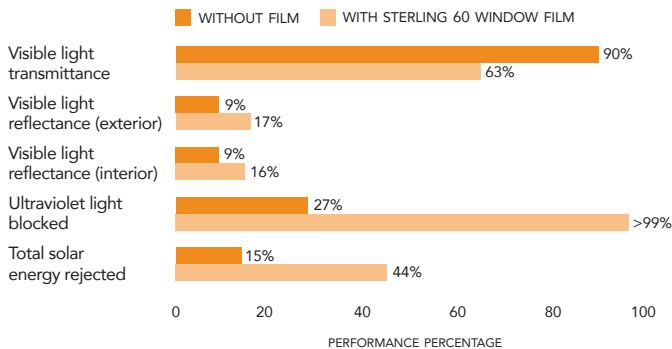

Performance results were generated from testing 4mm thick clear glass.

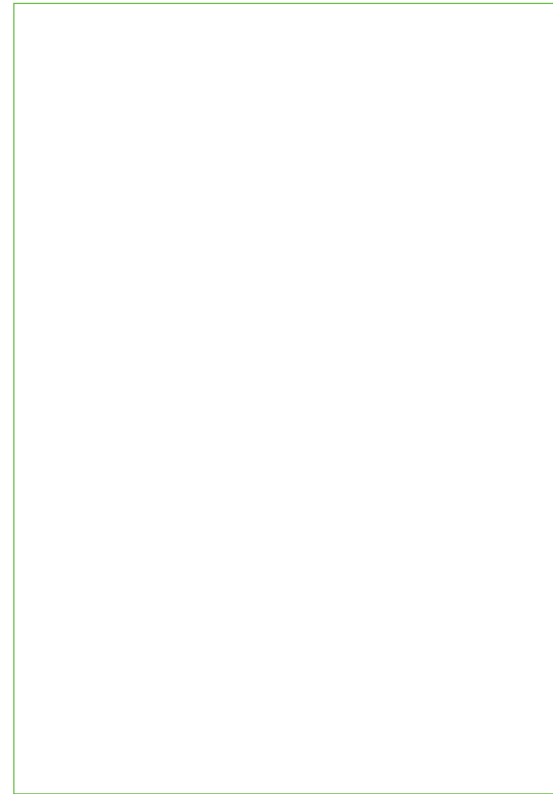


All performance results are based on the film installed on the inside surface of 4mm and 4mm+4mm thick, clear glass.
